Remember we need to only use capital letters for the start of sentences and proper nouns (special names for people, places and things.)

Try to use paragraphs to tell an introduction, (where we introduce the characters and tell where the story is taking place) body, (where we tell the problem and solution) and conclusion (where we tell how it ends)

We can also use adjectives (describing words) to help paint a picture in the readers mind.

You could make the story longer and even more exciting by describing what happened in the volcano and with the tiger - what did the class see and how did they feel?
