




# Tropical Paradise

Imagine beautiful white sand beaches washed by the soft waves of the Atlantic Ocean and Caribbean Sea. Here and there tall palms sway gently in the warm, tropical breeze. An abundance of brilliant tropical flowers greet the visitor's eye, and beyond the inviting beaches, a long range of lush green mountain ranges beckon. Does such a place actually exist? Try the island country of Puerto Rico.

This tropical paradise is really a little bit of the United States in the Caribbean, because the island is and has been a U.S. territory since 1898. English, along with Spanish, is spoken there, the mail bears U.S. postage stamps, the money is U.S. currency, and Puerto Ricans are U.S. citizens.

Modern malls and fast-food restaurants are common in Puerto Rico, but old Spanish influence is readily apparent as well, especially in architecture. A visit to San Juan, the capital, is a step back in history starting with the beautiful old churches and culminating with the battlements of the historic fort, El Morro, which still guards the natural harbor of San Juan.

No trip to Puerto Rico could be complete without a visit to El Yunque, the only tropical rain forest in the U.S. Forest Service, but take an umbrella because it rains, sometimes more than once a day and as much as 200 inches a year. The rain forest is also home to the tiny coqui (kō·kē') frog, beloved native of Puerto Rico, and the preserve boasts about 240 varieties of trees and flowers. All these complement the lush foliage, waterfalls, and spectacular view from El Yunque Peak.

Puerto Rico is also unique because of its people. Although originally inhabited by Taíno Indians, no full-blooded Indians now live there. Present-day inhabitants are descendants of, or are a mixture of, those who have played a part in Puerto Rico's history. While the tiny island is crowded with people of blended races, its beauty and lore remain unique.
