



F. Microphones Communicate Sounds

Many, many years ago some people in Spain were able to teach several deaf students to speak. They were also able to teach the students to read and write. In Spain a book was written about teaching the deaf to communicate. People in Germany also did a great work teaching the deaf to communicate.

Another country, the United States, learned from the work done in Spain and Germany. Today, many people in the United States teach and work with deaf people.

People who do not hear well will often hear better if they


wear a hearing aid. A hearing aid is a little box with a kind of microphone inside. The little microphone in the hearing aid will help a person who



does not hear well to hear better. It can help a person who hears very little to hear more. It makes sounds louder and clearer.
